For gross motor play, along with our very popular sprinkler and bike days, we

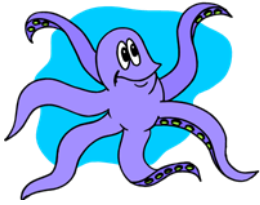
