Pelican News





Hello Rooster families!

Our theme this week was Camping!

Our kindergarten countdown chain is getting shorter by the day and the children more excited! We have been using our chain and yearly calendar to keep track of the days left which is giving the class a better sense of time as far as days and weeks go. We have also been counting our calendar and talking about past and upcoming events in terms of weeks. The visual prompt is useful as they can see how long a week is and talking about what is special about each day has really helped them with this concept! Our secondary Math theme for the past few weeks has been subtraction and the countdown chain has helped with this. Naturally, m&m math-subtraction has been far more popular as always!

Science this week was all about camping. We talked about what constitutes a good campsite and even went on a nature walk to see if there were any good ones near our school. While we were out, we took the time to gather up materials to make our own paintbrushes which was the perfect opportunity to really LOOK at the plants and talk about plants around a campsite you would want there and ones to avoid. We also talked about the animals and insects you might come into contact with while camping and how to keep the unwanted ones out of your campsite. We got a good overview of Virginia wildlife and plants! Our Project Green subject was Camp Clean-up and how to leave it as clean or cleaner than you found it.

Our language arts was a series of discussions in Group about camping subjects. The children love to add their input about any subject we are talking about! We talked about what we like best about camping (s'mores were pretty popular), where we have gone camping, who we went camping with, and what we saw when we were camping.



The most fun was telling campfire stories! One person would start the story with a sentence or two and the next child had to add to it, then the next etc. The stories got wilder and wilder and brought about much laughter! Friday was Toy Show and Tell which we do once a month. This is a fun way to get children comfortable talking in front of groups and great practice for active listening and appropriate questions from the audience!

Children's Humanities was also about camping. We talked about camping safely in various places such as a forest, the beach, or the mountains. We also talked a lot about what we would pack to go camping and played Grandma's Backpack which is always hilarious!

Art was so fun this week! We made tissue paper campfires, lightning bugs in a jar (which was good practice for small motor skills), painted a mural with our nature walk paintbrushes, and created tents at night with popsicle sticks and black paper!

Next week is our School Bus Field Trip and we are all excited about it! It is also the week the Peacocks and Roosters are doing a joint theme of The Olympic Games! This is going to be a blast and I can't wait to tell you all about it next week!
