

8 EARLY EDUCATION BEST PRACTICES BRIGHT BEGINNINGS IS FOLLOWING FOR PREVENTING COVID-19



01 DAILY WELLNESS CHECKS

Both students and staff will be assessed daily for the following: temperatures over 100.4 degrees, COVID-19 like symptoms, exposure to COVID-19 or a family member with COVID-19 like symptoms and travel out of country or to high risk states in past 14 days. Bright Beginnings reserves the right to send individuals home based on wellness check results.

02 DROP-OFF AND VISITORS

Families are asked to drop-off students outside the buildings to Bright Beginnings staff. All necessary visitors (state agencies) will be temperature checked and screened appropriately. All visitors will be required to wear masks, remove shoes and wash their hands upon entering the building. No visitors will be entering occupied classrooms.

03 STAFF SHOE CHANGE

All Bright Beginnings staff will change into their indoor school shoes upon entry to buildings.

04 INCREASED HANDWASHING

Handwashing will be required for both children and adults upon entry, exit and frequently throughout the day according to enhanced Bright Beginnings Policies.

05 LIMITED CLASSROOM MOVEMENT

Movement between classrooms throughout the day will be limited for both teachers and students to the best of our ability.

06 GROUP SIZING & SPACING

Group sizing will be decreased in the classrooms and physical spacing between children will be increased to the best of our ability.

07 SURFACE AND CLASSROOM CLEANING

Frequently touched classroom surfaces, objects and outdoor areas will be cleaned between uses and disinfected daily according to our enhanced cleaning checklist. Bright Beginnings has invested in portable sanitizing misters that are used each evening to deep clean surfaces and toys.

08 CENTER CLOSURE CONSIDERATIONS

If a COVID-19 case is reported, Bright Beginnings will do all they can to limit exposure. Closing classrooms or the entire center may be considered and evaluated on a case by case basis. Parents will be notified of potential exposure their student may have had while attending Bright Beginnings.
